

61ST REPUBLIC DAY CELEBRATED

BOMDILA – 26TH JAN'2010 : Amidst great jubilation and fanfare, the 61st Republic Day was celebrated here today at Bomdila. Unfurling the national tricolor, Deputy Commissioner Swati Sharma called upon the people to join hands- in-hands with the government for the all round development of the society. Exhorting the people to commit themselves for the peace and prosperity of the region, she maintained that, besides political equality, social and economic equality are of equal importance and till we attain economic equality, we cannot call ourselves a developed society, she said.
